In particular, Niagara Region Right To Life wishes to help educate and inform the younger generations about the preciousness and possibilities of human life from conception to natural death and how certain threats affect those possibilities in its beginnings.



## FATHER TED COLLETON: AN INTRODUCTION

- Father Edward (Ted) Colleton (b. 1913-d. 2011) promoted pro-life principles and values for almost seven decades.
- Born in Dublin, Ireland in 1913, he entered the Spiritan Order in 1932, was ordained a priest in 1940 and was assigned to serve in Kenya.
- Forced to leave Kenya in 1971 he was reassigned to Canada, a nation that was liberalizing abortion services.
- He joined the pro-life movement to try and educate the public, especially his beloved young people, about the tragedy of abortion.
- For more than 35 years Father Ted was a compelling pro-life writer and speaker, gentle teacher, committed activist, and raconteur par excellence, communicating to hundreds of thousands of people.
- He was arrested and jailed for his witnessing against the evil of abortion laws or lack thereof.
- Father Ted believed that prayer was the most important action of human beings in winning the right to life for unborn generations present and to come.
- One of his favourite quotations was that from Edmund Burke: "All evil needs to flourish is that good men do nothing." He always called on the good young people in our society to do something instead.
- Father Ted died peacefully on April 26, 2011. His life work will inspire many for generations to come.



## Scholarship Awards

As many as three prizes are offered: \$1500.00 first prize, \$800 second prize and \$500 third prize. A writing contest organized by Niagara Region Right to Life is a determining factor in the awarding of the scholarship prizes.

### Eligible candidates must:

- be senior high school students (grade 11 or 12) attending a high school (or be homeschooled) in Canada
- submit one letter of reference from a school staff member or community representative
- provide a brief self-profile outlining participation in school life/community activities and a description of their interest/involvement in the pro-life cause and
- the student must submit a typed original essay, approximately 1,200 words in length, written in the first person narrative, and accompanied by proper documentation/annotation of content presented. The essay plus other documents should be submitted preferably by email to [dirocco@theinterim.com](mailto:dirocco@theinterim.com) and if by regular mail it must be postmarked no later than Monday, December 3, 2018.

*The theme or topic for this year is the following:*

**You are a child in the prenatal stage of development. Are all the current biomedical/technological breakthroughs helpful in advancing your right to life as a preborn human being?**

### Program: Rules and Regulations

This responsibility rests with a committee selected by Niagara Region Right To Life

Copyrights to any essay submitted for the purpose of the contest will be retained by Niagara Region Right To Life. Any publication or other use of the work would be acknowledged by naming its author.

Please note that prize winners are asked to provide a photo of themselves so it can accompany the publication of their essay.

**Students related to employees or volunteers of Niagara Region Right To Life are ineligible, as are previous prize winners in this scholarship program.**

## Announcement of winning entry

The winners will be declared by February 1, 2019 by Niagara Region Right To Life. Criteria for the selection of winners include the quality of essays submitted. Lack of prior involvement in the pro-life movement does not disqualify the students from the scholarships.
